As the new liturgical year begins, the Church invites us once again to enter into the sacred season of Advent - a time not only of expectation but of transformation. Pope Leo XIV's Advent message for 2025 speaks powerfully to our moment in history: "To wait is not to pause, but to participate; to prepare the way of the Lord in the world as it is."

In a society often driven by noise, speed, and distraction, Advent calls us to slow down and look inward. But it is not a retreat into ourselves. It is a journey of conversion, compassion, and community, echoing John the Baptist's cry in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths." (Mark 1:3)

Pope Leo challenges us to respond to the world's wounds with compassion and justice; whether through service projects, care for the poor, ecological responsibility, or building bridges of peace in our divided society. "Let us be signs of the Kingdom that is already breaking in," he says.

The Advent wreath that graces our chapel and classrooms is more than decoration. Each candle reminds us that light breaks into the darkness, gradually, faithfully. As we light each flame, may we also kindle faith, joy, and mercy in our campus and in our world.

Lord Jesus, we are not waiting for a holiday; we are waiting for You.




Career Awareness and Professional Exposure


